Rev. Deborah Lee is the Program Director of PANA, the Institute for Leadership Development and Study of Pacific Asian North American Religion, since its inception in 2000 as a center at the Pacific School of Religion. Rev. Lee serves at PANA through a 4-way covenant through her ordination with the NCNC UCC. PANA nurtures emerging leaders in Asian American and Pacific Islander faith communities and promotes justice oriented discourse and critical voices on contemporary social issues. At PANA Deborah Lee has helped to shape theological and interfaith programs involving youth and young adults, congregational and community leaders, and the academic community. Rev. Lee is also involved with the International Women's Network Against Militarism which seeks to hold the U.S. government accountable for the violence, sexual exploitation, economic and environmental effects of U.S. militarism in the many countries which host U.S. bases. Prior to coming to PANA, Rev. Lee served as the Director of the Pacific and Asian American Center for Theology and Strategies (PACTS), part of the Graduate Theological Union in Berkeley, Training Director of the Center for Ethics and Economic Policy in Berkeley, and as a Community Development worker in northeastern Brazil. She earned her Master of Divinity at the Pacific School of Religion with an emphasis on theology and race, gender and global justice. She is also a mother. Her home church is New Fellowship, United Church of Christ in Berkeley.
